NRS 373.030 Imposition of tax in certain counties.

1. In any county for all or part of which a streets and highways plan has been adopted as a part of the master plan by the county or regional planning commission pursuant to [NRS 278.150](#), the board may by ordinance impose a tax on motor vehicle fuel, except aviation fuel and leaded racing fuel, sold in the county in an amount not to exceed 9 cents per gallon.

2. A tax imposed pursuant to this section is in addition to other motor vehicle fuel taxes imposed pursuant to the provisions of [chapter 365](#) of NRS.

3. As used in this section:

(a) "Aviation fuel" has the meaning ascribed to it in [NRS 365.015](#).

(b) "Leaded racing fuel" means motor vehicle fuel that contains lead and is produced for motor vehicles that are designed and built for racing and not for operation on a public highway.

NRS 373.060 Effective date of tax imposed pursuant to [NRS 373.030](#). Any ordinance enacted pursuant to [NRS 373.030](#) must provide that the county motor vehicle fuel tax will be imposed on the first day of the second calendar month following the enactment of the ordinance.

(Added to NRS by [1965, 1266](#); A [1989, 1502](#); [2009, 860](#))

NRS 373.062 Imposition of tax on diesel fuel in certain counties whose population is less than 100,000; rate; approval of board of county commissioners or voters; increases in the tax; effective date of the tax; exemption.

1. In a county whose population is less than 100,000 and for all or part of which a streets and highways plan has been adopted as a part of the master plan by the county or regional planning commission pursuant to [NRS 278.150](#), the board may by ordinance impose a tax on special fuel that consists of diesel fuel sold in the county in an amount not to exceed 5 cents per gallon.

2. A board may not adopt an ordinance authorized by this section unless:

(a) The ordinance is approved by at least a two-thirds majority of the members of the board; or

(b) A question concerning the imposition of the tax pursuant to this section is first approved by a majority of the registered voters of the county voting upon the question, which the board may submit to the voters at any general election. The Committee on Local Government Finance shall annually provide to each city clerk, county clerk and district attorney in a county whose population is less than 100,000 forms for submitting a question to the registered voters of a county pursuant to this paragraph. Any question submitted to the registered voters of a county pursuant to this paragraph must be in the form most recently provided by the Committee on Local Government Finance.

3. A tax imposed pursuant to this section is in addition to other special fuel taxes imposed pursuant to the provisions of [chapters 366](#) and [445C](#) of NRS.

4. If an ordinance adopted pursuant to this section imposes the tax in an amount that is less than 5 cents per gallon, any increase in the amount of the tax must be approved in the manner set forth in subsection 2. Any such increase must not cause the amount of the tax authorized by this section to exceed 5 cents per gallon.

5. Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, any ordinance enacted pursuant to this section must provide that the tax authorized by this section, or any change in the amount of the tax, will become effective on the first day of the second calendar month following enactment of the ordinance imposing, or changing the amount of, the tax. An ordinance adopted pursuant to this section to impose the tax authorized by this section may not become effective earlier than January 1, 2020.

6. Any tax imposed pursuant to the provisions of this section does not apply to any sales or uses described in [NRS 366.200](#), except to any sales or uses described in subsection 1 of that section of any diesel fuel to which dye has not been added pursuant to federal law or the law of this State, of a type which is lawfully sold in this State both:

(a) As diesel fuel to which dye has been added pursuant to such law; and

(b) As diesel fuel to which dye has not been added pursuant to such law.

NRS 373.065 Additional taxes in counties whose population is less than 700,000: Imposition; rates and annual increases; approval of voters; effective dates; annual review; distribution and use of proceeds.

1. Except as otherwise provided in this section and [NRS 373.068](#), in a county whose population is less than 700,000:

(a) The board may by ordinance impose:

(1) An excise tax on each gallon of motor vehicle fuel, except aviation fuel, sold in the county in an amount equal to the product obtained by multiplying the amount of the tax imposed pursuant to [NRS 365.180](#) by the lesser of 4.5 percent or the average percentage of increase in the Consumer Price Index for West Urban Consumers for the preceding 5 years; and

(2) An annual increase in the tax imposed pursuant to subparagraph (1), on the first day of each fiscal year following the fiscal year in which that tax becomes effective, in an amount equal to the sum of the tax imposed pursuant to [NRS 365.180](#) and the tax imposed pursuant to subparagraph (1) during the preceding fiscal year, multiplied by the lesser of 4.5 percent or the average percentage of increase in the Consumer Price Index for West Urban Consumers for the preceding 5 years.

(b) The board may by ordinance impose:

(1) An excise tax on each gallon of motor vehicle fuel, except aviation fuel, sold in the county in an amount equal to the product obtained by multiplying the amount of the tax imposed pursuant to [NRS 365.190](#) by the lesser of 4.5 percent or the average percentage of increase in the Consumer Price Index for West Urban Consumers for the preceding 5 years; and

(c) The board may by ordinance impose:

(1) An excise tax on each gallon of motor vehicle fuel, except aviation fuel, sold in the county in an amount equal to the product obtained by multiplying the amount of the tax imposed pursuant to [NRS 365.192](#) by the lesser of 4.5 percent or the average percentage of increase in the Consumer Price Index for West Urban Consumers for the preceding 5 years; and

(2) An annual increase in the tax imposed pursuant to subparagraph (1), on the first day of each fiscal year following the fiscal year in which that tax becomes effective, in an amount equal to the sum of the tax imposed pursuant to [NRS 365.192](#) and the tax imposed pursuant to subparagraph (1) during the preceding fiscal year, multiplied by

the lesser of 4.5 percent or the average percentage of increase in the Consumer Price Index for West Urban Consumers for the preceding 5 years.

(d) If the board imposes a tax pursuant to [NRS 373.030](#), the board may by ordinance impose:

(1) An excise tax on each gallon of motor vehicle fuel, except aviation fuel and leaded racing fuel, sold in the county in an amount equal to the product obtained by multiplying the amount of the tax imposed pursuant to [NRS 373.030](#) by the lesser of 4.5 percent or the average percentage of increase in the Consumer Price Index for West Urban Consumers for the preceding 5 years; and

(2) An annual increase in the tax imposed pursuant to subparagraph (1), on the first day of each fiscal year following the fiscal year in which that tax becomes effective, in an amount equal to the sum of the tax imposed pursuant to [NRS 373.030](#) and the tax imposed pursuant to subparagraph (1) during the preceding fiscal year, multiplied by the lesser of 4.5 percent or the average percentage of increase in the Consumer Price Index for West Urban Consumers for the preceding 5 years.

2. A board may not adopt any ordinance authorized by this section unless:

(a) In a county for all or part of which a streets and highways plan has been adopted as a part of the master plan by the county or regional planning commission pursuant to [NRS 278.150](#), the board first:

(1) Imposes a tax pursuant to [NRS 373.030](#) at the maximum rate authorized pursuant to that paragraph; or

(2) Submits to the voters of the county at a general or special election the question of whether to impose a tax pursuant to [NRS 373.030](#) at the maximum rate authorized pursuant to that paragraph; and

(b) A question concerning the imposition of the tax pursuant to this section is first approved by a majority of the registered voters of the county voting upon the question which the board may submit to the voters at any general election. The Committee on Local Government Finance shall annually provide to each city clerk, county clerk and district attorney in this State forms for submitting a question to the registered voters of a county pursuant to this paragraph. Any question submitted to the registered voters of a county pursuant to this paragraph must be in the form most recently provided by the Committee on Local Government Finance.

3. An ordinance adopted pursuant to this section in a county whose population is less than 100,000:

(a) Must be reapproved, in addition to the approval required by paragraph (b) of subsection 2, at least once every 8 years by a majority of the registered voters of the county voting on the question which the board may submit to the voters at any general election; and

(b) Expires by limitation no later than the last day of the 8th calendar year following the calendar year in which the ordinance was:

(1) Approved in accordance with paragraph (b) of subsection 2; or

(2) Most recently reapproved in accordance with this subsection,

↪ whichever occurs later.

4. Any ordinance authorized by this section may be adopted in combination with any other ordinance authorized by this section. Each tax imposed pursuant to this section is in addition to any other motor vehicle fuel taxes imposed pursuant to the provisions of this chapter and [chapter 365](#) of NRS. Upon adoption of an ordinance authorized by this section, no further action by the board is necessary to effectuate the annual increases before the ordinance expires by limitation or the authority to impose additional tax increases expires by limitation pursuant to [NRS 373.068](#).

5. Any ordinance adopted pursuant to this section must:

(a) Become effective on the first day of the first calendar quarter beginning not less than 90 days after the adoption of the ordinance; and

(b) If the board has created a commission in the county, require the commission:

(1) To review, at a public meeting conducted after the provision of public notice and before the effective date of each annual increase imposed by the ordinance:

(I) The amount of that increase and the accuracy of its calculation;

(II) The amounts of any annual increases imposed by the ordinance in previous years and the revenue collected pursuant to those increases;

(III) Any improvements to the regional system of transportation resulting from revenue collected pursuant to any annual increases imposed by the ordinance in previous years; and

(IV) Any other information relevant to the effect of the annual increases on the public; and

(2) To submit to the board any information the commission receives suggesting that the annual increase should be adjusted.

6. Any ordinance adopted pursuant to:

(a) Paragraph (a) of subsection 1 must:

(1) Require the allocation, disbursement and use in the county of the proceeds of the tax imposed pursuant to that ordinance in the same proportions and manner as the allocation, disbursement and use in the county of the proceeds of the tax imposed pursuant to [NRS 365.180](#); and

(2) Expire by limitation no later than the effective date of any increase or decrease in the amount of the tax imposed pursuant to [NRS 365.180](#) which becomes effective after the adoption of that ordinance.

(b) Paragraph (b) of subsection 1 must:

(1) Require the allocation, disbursement and use in the county of the proceeds of the tax imposed pursuant to that ordinance in the same proportions and manner as the allocation, disbursement and use in the county of the proceeds of the tax imposed pursuant to [NRS 365.190](#); and

(2) Expire by limitation no later than the effective date of any increase or decrease in the amount of the tax imposed pursuant to [NRS 365.190](#) which becomes effective after the adoption of that ordinance.

(c) Paragraph (c) of subsection 1 must:

(1) Require the allocation, disbursement and use in the county of the proceeds of the tax imposed pursuant to that ordinance in the same proportions and manner as the allocation, disbursement and use in the county of the proceeds of the tax imposed pursuant to [NRS 365.192](#); and

(2) Expire by limitation no later than the effective date of any increase or decrease in the amount of the tax imposed pursuant to [NRS 365.192](#) which becomes effective after the adoption of that ordinance.

(d) Paragraph (d) of subsection 1 must:

(1) Require the allocation, disbursement and use in the county of the proceeds of the tax imposed pursuant to that ordinance in the same proportions and manner as the allocation, disbursement and use in the county of the proceeds of the tax imposed pursuant to [NRS 373.030](#); and

(2) Expire by limitation no later than the effective date of any subsequent ordinance increasing or decreasing the amount of the tax imposed in that county pursuant to [NRS 373.030](#).

CHANGING THE HOURS OF OPERATION OF CERTAIN COUNTY OFFICES

WHEREAS, pursuant to NRS 245.040 and NRS 252.050 the Eureka Board of County Commissioners (hereinafter referred to as “the BOCC”), may designate and establish by order entered into the minutes the days and hours during which the offices of the Sheriff, County Recorder and County Auditor, County Clerk, County Assessor and County Treasurer (245.040) and District Attorney (NRS 252.050) must be kept open for the transaction of public business; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to NRS 245.040 and NRS 252.050, the BOCC may deviate from the hours of operation except that no deviation may conflict with the election laws of this State and such a plan must be fiscally neutral or result in cost savings, and

WHEREAS, the BOCC has been presented, on September 16, 2025, by the County Clerk, County Assessor and the Chief Information Officer, a request to appoint a committee to collect data from the County offices to change the hours of operation to a four-day, ten hour a day work week; and

WHEREAS, the BOCC found in favor of appointing such a committee and set a Public Hearing date of November 18, 2025, to be held in the Eureka County Commission Chambers in the County Courthouse at 10 South Main Street, Eureka, NV. at 10:00 a.m.; and

WHEREAS, the Committee collected data of Friday public foot traffic, which showed that across thirty seven Fridays the Courthouse averaged fewer than four total in-person interactions and that more than half of all Fridays saw zero visitors; and


WHEREAS, the Committee also conducted a survey of all full-time County employees, the results of which were presented during the Public Hearing on November 18, 2025, and the data showed a majority preference for a Monday-Thursday, four day week, ten hour a day schedule, and

WHEREAS, the BOCC determined that a twelve-month pilot program, beginning the first pay period in January, (starting on January 4, 2026), would be in the best interest of the citizens and employees of Eureka County, and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Eureka Board of County Commissioners as follows:

- A. The offices of the Eureka County Sheriff, Assessor, Clerk-Recorder, Treasurer and Comptroller (Auditor), District Attorney and Justice Court shall be open for the transaction of public business, Monday through Thursday, from 7:00 a.m. until 5:30 p.m., **closed** for lunch between 12:30 p.m. and 1:00 p.m., and closed on Friday, for a period of one year, commencing on January 4, 2026, where the schedule will be revisited during a January 2027 BOCC meeting to see if the schedule will be permanently implemented.
- B. That the Public Works Department hours of operation for the transaction of public business will also be Monday through Thursday, from 7:00 a.m. until 5:30 p.m., **open** for lunch between 12:30 p.m. and 1:00 p.m., and closed on Friday.
- C. The BOCC agrees that the other County Offices not mentioned in NRS 245.040 or NRS 252.050, could also adopt a 4-10 work week or flex employee hours to remain on a 5-8 work week, or do what best fits their departments and the citizens of Eureka County.

**PROCLAMATION DECLARING JANUARY 2026 AS
“NATIONAL RADON ACTION MONTH IN NEVADA”**

WHEREAS, the state of Nevada, known for its natural beauty, is also home to abundant uranium deposits that, while beneficial in certain applications, naturally break down into radon gas—a colorless, odorless, radioactive gas that can pose serious health risks to residents; and

WHEREAS, radon exposure is the leading cause of lung cancer among nonsmokers and the second leading cause among smokers, with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency estimating that 21,000 Americans lose their lives each year due to lung cancer caused by radon; and

WHEREAS, *in addition to lung cancer*, emerging research has connected radon exposure to an increased risk of stroke in post-menopausal women as well as a potential link to childhood leukemia, underscoring the broader public health implications of radon exposure; and

WHEREAS, lung cancer tragically claims the lives of more women than breast cancer and all other cancers combined, emphasizing the significant risk posed to Nevadans, who face an even higher likelihood of radon-related lung cancer compared to the national average; and

WHEREAS, an estimated one in four homes in Nevada has elevated radon levels, and radon concentrations can vary widely between neighboring homes, making community awareness and individual testing essential; and

WHEREAS, testing is the only reliable method to detect elevated radon levels in homes, and this simple, low-cost process can lead to effective mitigation efforts that significantly reduce health risks and improve the safety of Nevada households; and

WHEREAS, the University of Nevada, Reno Extension’s Nevada Radon Education Program, in partnership with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, continues to support statewide initiatives to educate Nevadans about radon risks, promote mitigation, and encourage radon-resistant new construction;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Eureka Board of County Commissioners hereby proclaims **January 2026** as “**National Radon Action Month in Nevada**” and urges all residents to protect their health and the health of their families by testing their homes for radon. Free radon test kits will be available throughout January and February at numerous pick-up locations, including Extension offices statewide, to help Nevadans ensure a safe and healthy home environment.

Public Works Director Rowley presented to the Board in place of Planning Commission Chair Russell Conley, Josh Lowe submitted a piece of property located in Diamond Valley to be divided in half, he is the buyer of one of the halves. The Planning Commission met and approved of the parcel division.

Commissioner Plaskett motioned to approve the parcel map submitted by Josh Lowe for division of property in Diamond Valley (a portion of APN 007-260-01). Chairman McKay seconded the motion. The motion carried 2-0.

NORTHEASTERN NEVADA REGIONAL DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY (NNRDA) –

Sheldon Mudd, Executive Director NNRDA

1. Discuss, approve or deny renewing the interlocal cooperative agreement with Northeastern Nevada Regional Development Authority for January 1, 2026 - December 31, 2030, and allow the Chair to sign outside of the meeting. **(For Possible Action)**

NNRDA Executive Director Sheldon Mudd presented via Webex, the interlocal cooperative agreement with Northeastern Nevada Regional Development Authority will be extended for another 5 years. Chairman McKay commented the NNRDA is a valuable organization for Eureka County to participate in, working with developers and different mining interests and how they contribute to the community.

HUMAN RESOURCES-Cristina Lopez, Human Resources Director

1. Report on Human Resources projects and activities. (Discussion)

Human Resources Director Cristina Lopez reported the county has 94 benefited employees and 4 open positions. Director Lopez helped interview for the Sheriff and Clerk Recorder offices. She continues to work on the NeoGov implementation for the new HR system, she is working closely with the Comptroller and other supervisory employees. December 11th was the county Christmas party and there were approximately 130 attendees.

2. Discuss, approve or deny reestablishing and implementing Eureka County's Mission, Vision and Values previously approved by the Board on June 3, 2023. (For Possible Action)

Eureka Counties mission, vision and values has not been updated since 2023, Director Lopez believes reaffirming the values can help with prevention and accountability. Setting standards helps to guide employees and their supervisors.

Item was tabled until all Commissioners were in attendance.

The board recessed for lunch break.

Chairman McKay called the meeting back to order at 12:39pm.

AMBULANCE AND EMS – Nichole Cooley, EMS Director/Coordinator

1. Report on EMS projects and activities. (Discussion)

EMS Director/Coordinator Nichole Cooley reported Crescent Valley recently had multiple calls in the same hour, and Cortez sent their ambulance and paramedics to help cover a call. For November Eureka had 8 calls, MedEx in Eureka had 3, Crescent Valley had 7 and Medex in Crescent Valley had 3, they brought in \$14,000.

2. Report on contract services. (Discussion)

The Eureka clinic had 198 patients, Pena saw 103, Laurel saw 78, Harper saw 4, Rocky saw 13 and the Crescent Valley clinic had 21 patients.

3. Discuss and consider updating the name only on the former contract to house EMS contracted service providers, with D&D rentals for the contract to reflect the new owners company name, C&R Hills RV Park. **(For Possible Action)**

C&R Hills RV Park purchased D&D Rentals, they are on board to continue housing the contracted EMS providers, all that is changing in the agreement is the name.

Commissioner Plaskett motioned to approve updating the name only on the former contract to house EMS contracted service providers to reflect the new owners' company name, C&R Hills RV Park. Chairman McKay seconded the motion. The motion carried 2-0.

4. Discuss, approve or deny recommendation from Eureka County Emergency Medical Services regarding the top-ranked proposals/candidate for the Crescent Valley Emergency Ambulance Services and provide specific direction to the EMS Director in proceeding with the next steps, including contract negotiations to start outside of meeting. **(For Possible Action)**

EMS Director/Coordinator Nichole Cooley put together a committee to go through the submitted proposals, they also held a meeting for the Crescent Valley public to come, ask questions and share their concerns. EMS Director Cooley is recommending Medex for the contracted Crescent Valley Emergency Ambulance Services for a total of \$300,000.00.

Commissioner Plaskett motioned to approve entering into contract negotiations with Medex for Crescent Valley Emergency Ambulance Services. Chairman McKay seconded the motion. The motion carried 2-0.

5. Discuss, approve or deny a quote for CAD/HHI integration for Sun Ridge Systems for integration with RIMS for an amount not to exceed \$5,500.00. for IT capital outlay (010-018-55010-000) previously approved by the BOCC. **(For Possible Action)**

Item was tabled.

SHERIFF- Miles Umina, Sheriff

1. Report on Sheriff's Office projects and activities.

Sheriff Miles Umina reported for the month of November there were 144 traffic stops with 54 citations written, no arrests but there are still 4 in custody. In Crescent Valley a deputy was bitten by a dog which led them to reevaluate the dog ordinance and some changes that will need to be made.

2. Discuss, approve or deny the purchasing of two new vehicles for the replacement of two patrol vehicles from Champion Chevrolet utilizing State Purchasing Bid #99SWC-S3138 Fleet Vehicle. Both vehicles will need to be upfitted for patrol after purchase. 1st Vehicle Item #5.3 - Chevy Tahoe for the amount of \$70,300 2nd Vehicle Item #2.13 - 2500 Chevy crew cab pickup for the amount of \$69,700. Both are to be paid with money budgeted for Sheriff's Vehicles Capital Outlay (010-034-55010-092). **(For Possible Action)**

Undersheriff Cobb presented to the Board 2 new vehicles to replace 2 trucks in the Sheriff fleet, they are choosing diesel trucks to help pull the equipment trailers they have. The Sheriff's office rotates out 2 trucks a year and they are choosing to replace Ford with Chevy. The amount needed for upfitting the trucks will be on a later agenda.

Commissioner Plaskett motioned to approve the purchase of two new vehicles for the replacement of two patrol vehicles from Champion Chevrolet utilizing State Purchasing Bid #99SWC-S3138 Fleet Vehicle. 1st Vehicle Item #5.3 - Chevy Tahoe for the amount of \$70,300 2nd Vehicle Item #2.13 - 2500 Chevy crew cab pickup for the amount of \$69,700. Both are to be paid with money budgeted for Sheriff's Vehicles Capital Outlay (010-034-55010-092). Chairman McKay seconded the motion. The motion carried 2-0.

Lexipol will help the Sheriff's office with updating policies, Sheriff Umina explained the payment schedule for contracting services with Lexipol; for fiscal year 2025 the writing and implementation will be \$5,180.00 and the policy management platform will be in the amount of \$3,764.53. In July for fiscal year 2026 the contract will be in the amount of \$11,293.60 and the final portion for full implementation will be \$5,180.00.

Commissioner Plaskett motioned to approve contracting services with Lexipol for Policy writing and implementation for \$5,180.00 and policy management platform in the amount of \$3,764.53 for fiscal year 2025. The yearly contract for the platform in the amount of \$11,293.60 and final portion of full implementation for \$5,180.00 for fiscal year 2026. Chairman McKay seconded the motion. The motion carried 2-0.

PUBLIC WORKS/COUNTY FACILITIES – Jeb Rowley, Public Works Director

1. Update on Public Works projects and activities, including activities and events at County-managed facilities. **(Discussion)**

Public Works Director Jeb Rowley reported for the month of November; the Museum had 70 visitors, the Opera House had 614 visitors, for the holiday craft bazaar the Opera House had 21 booths and 282 visitors. The Eureka swimming pool had 107 visitors; they are preparing to get numbers for the deck and locker room floor resurfacing that was budgeted for 2026. The Eureka landfill had 526 customers for a total of 369 yards of municipal solid waste. The Crescent Valley transfer site had 19 customers with 181 yards of waste. Painting of the Senior center and Eureka clinic is finished and they will use the leftover paint in the well 2 building. Two road operators are scheduled for their CDL testing at the Elko Motor Carrier site, all the SCBA compressors are serviced at the Diamond Valley, Eureka and Crescent Valley fire stations.

2. Discuss, approve or deny an amendment for additional scope in the contract with Lumos & Associates for engineering, design, and related professional services for Eureka Town Phase 2C in the amount of \$293,950.00 utilizing monies budgeted for surveying and engineering in the Regional Transportation Commission Fund (025-110-55010-357) and the Eureka Water & Sewer Fund (045-177/178-55010-357) for a total contract price of \$376,710.00. *Note: This includes initial design approved in the amount of \$82,760.00, final design for Phase 2C in amount of \$173,950.00, and includes right of way dedications, abandonment, or easements in the amount of \$120,000.00.*
(For Possible Action)

Public Works Assistant Director Jayme Halpin explained the final design in the Eureka Town Water and Sewer improvement project is Phase 2C. The amount of \$293,950.00 will utilize monies budgeted for surveying and engineering in the Regional Transportation Commission Fund (025-110-55010-357) and the Eureka Water & Sewer Fund (045-177/178-55010-357) for a total contract price of \$376,710.00.

Commissioner Plaskett motioned to approve an amendment for additional scope in the contract with Lumos & Associates for engineering, design, and related professional services for Eureka Town Phase 2C in the amount of \$293,950.00 utilizing monies budgeted for surveying and engineering in the Regional Transportation Commission Fund (025-110-55010-357) and the Eureka Water & Sewer Fund (045-177/178-55010-357) for a total contract price of \$376,710.00. Chairman McKay seconded the motion. The motion carried 2-0.

3. Discuss, approve or deny application for a 2-inch commercial water service for APN 002-032-22 (at 330 3rd Street, Crescent Valley). **(For Possible Action)**

Commissioner Plaskett motioned to approve an application for a 2-inch commercial water service for APN 002-032-22 (at 330 3rd Street, Crescent Valley). Chairman McKay seconded the motion. The motion carried 2-0.

NATURAL RESOURCES – Jake Tibbitts, Natural Resources Manager

1. Report on current and emerging natural resource issues affecting Eureka County. **(Discussion)**

Natural Resources Manager Jake Tibbitts reported the Diamond Valley Groundwater Management Plan annual meeting reported the pumping last season was 55,000-acre feet of water which is almost exactly what it was the year prior. They believe the water rights that were retired helped with the water levels. The state has made it clear that they will enforce penalties if someone overuses their amount of water. The individual will have 30 days to replace the water in the account or they will be fined. The Humboldt River Basin Water Authority met and discussed the replacement for the State Engineer. The Mule Deer Enhancement Program will be applying aerial seeds on the Whistler Mountain range.

2. Discuss and consider responses to current efforts by US Fish and Wildlife Service to revise various regulations to implement the Endangered Species Act (ESA) including FWS-HQ-ES-2025-0029 (ESA Section 4(d) – “Blanket rule” / threatened species protections); FWS-HQ-ES-2025-0048 (ESA Section 4(b)(2) – Critical habitat exclusion framework); FWS-HQ-ES-2025-0044 (ESA Section 7 – Interagency consultation); and FWS-HQ-ES-2025-0039 (ESA Section 4 – Listing/delisting & critical habitat determinations). **(For Possible Action)**

The letter to the US Fish and Wildlife Service comments in support of the 4 rules “Blanket rule”/threatened species protections, Critical habitat exclusion framework, Interagency consultation, and Listing/delisting & critical habitat determinations. The changes will restore back to the regulations that existed before the Biden administration. NRAC will meet following the BOCC meeting to discuss and approve the letter.

Commissioner Plaskett motioned to approve responses to current efforts by US Fish and Wildlife Service to revise various regulations to implement the Endangered Species Act (ESA) and allow NRAC to add anything deemed necessary. Chairman McKay seconded the motion. The motion carried 2-0.

3. Discuss and consider response to proposed rule by US Environmental Protection Agency and US Department of the Army that would clarify the definition of "waters of the United States" and fully implement the US Supreme Court decision, Sackett v. Environmental Protection Agency. **(For Possible Action)**

Eureka County has always supported the rules by US Environmental Protection Agency and US Department of the Army due to the Humboldt River being determined a “Waters of the United States”. NRAC will also discuss the item and comment on the effects of roads and culverts the proposed rules will have.

Commissioner Plaskett motioned to approve responding to the proposed rule by US Environmental Protection Agency and US Department of the Army that would clarify the definition of "waters of the United States" and fully implement the US Supreme Court decision, Sackett v. Environmental Protection Agency. Chairman McKay seconded the motion. The motion carried 2-0.

4. Discuss and consider sending letter expressing support with certain amended language of the Standardizing Permitting and Expediting Economic Development Act (SPEED Act). **(For Possible Action)**

The Utah “7 Counties Decision” states that the BLM failed to properly implement NEPA by considering impacts far removed. NRAC will discuss commenting on removing language to not “box in” the impacts rail projects could have.

Commissioner Plaskett motioned to approve NRAC sending a letter expressing support with certain amended language of the Standardizing Permitting and Expediting Economic Development Act (SPEED Act) and allowing the Chair to sign outside of the meeting. Chairman McKay seconded the motion. The motion carried 2-0.

Discuss, approve or deny a stipend to secure the availability of one prosecutor on each Friday offices are closed beginning Friday, January 9, 2026. *Note: NRS 178.760 provides a stipend of \$450 for a prosecutor to be available on weekends and holidays; this action item will provide a stipend for each Friday Eureka County offices are closed. (For Possible Action)*

This letter provides information about the District Attorney's request to fund Friday coverage for one prosecutor. With the County's pilot program of a Monday to Thursday work week, work on Friday, beginning January 9, 2026, will be performed on a day off, and the law requires pay for all time worked.

The Board passed a resolution December 2, 2025 for the four-day work week. For hourly employees, work on Friday or other day off can be accomplished by paying overtime, or by the supervisor agreeing with the employee to flex the hourly employee's schedule during the 4 day work week, so the employee may be available to work on a Friday or other day off without paying overtime.

For prosecutors who are paid a salary, overtime is not possible because they are not paid by the hour. Flexing the work schedule is also not possible because of the amount of work required to be done each day of the 4 day work week. The DA's Office has just two prosecutors, and there is a lot of work to be done each week, including work on Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays.

For a few years now state law has provided for a stipend to pay prosecutors, the public defender, and the Justice of the Peace to be available on Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays for pretrial custody hearings. These hearings must be conducted before the Justice Court within 48 hours after a person is arrested. The state law that provides a stipend for this work is NRS 178.760, and the stipend has been set at \$450, regardless of how many hearings there are, or how long the hearings take.

Regular days off in Eureka County beginning in 2026 include Fridays, Saturdays, and Sundays. Despite the additional day added to the traditional weekend, the District Attorney's Office is not asking for more money beyond the \$450 already provided by NRS 178.760 for Justice Court pretrial custody hearings, because a person arrested on a Friday may have a hearing on Saturday or Sunday and still satisfy the 48 hour requirement, and all participants for the hearing (a prosecutor, a defense counsel, and a Justice of the Peace) are already being compensated for that Saturday and Sunday and holiday work by state law.

In addition, the Justice Court can avoid setting hearings on Fridays, now that Friday is a day off. But the addition of Fridays to the weekend has not changed what the District Court's schedule demands. District Court, by order of the Nevada Supreme Court, still holds hearings on Fridays in Eureka County.

Rule 3 of the Rules of Practice for the Seventh Judicial District Court directs that District Court is held every Monday in White Pine County, the second and fourth Fridays in Lincoln County, and the first and third Fridays in Eureka County.

District Court hearings on Monday or Friday free up the rest of the District Court calendar (Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday) for extended hearings and trials.

For example, as of the writing of this letter December 22, 2025, there are many District Court cases already set in 2026 for Friday hearings and deadlines in Eureka County (in alphabetical order by Defendant's last name):

For each of these District Court cases, a prosecutor must be prepared to participate in the hearing, and after each hearing, draft a proposed order for the District Court judge's review and signature. Before and after each hearing, many hours are dedicated by a prosecutor to preparation of the case and the necessary paperwork.

To continue to provide Friday coverage by at least one prosecutor, the DA's Office is requesting a stipend of \$450 for every Friday. Beginning with January 9, 2026, which is the first Friday in 2026 after the 4 day work week begins, there will be 25 Fridays until June 30, 2026, which is the end of the current fiscal year.

The amount to be paid out is 25 Fridays x \$450 stipend = \$11,250. This funding amount is available in the DA's current budget because a funded position for a casual (non-attorney) employee has not been filled. To cover next fiscal year, which begins in July, the DA's Office will include in its budget request a stipend amount to cover Friday along with the already established state mandated stipend for Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays coverage.

No such additional stipend is necessary for the public defender, because she is a contract employee and not a Eureka County employee, and not subject to a set work week or any number of hours each week. The Justice of the Peace is not required to appear for District Court hearings, so no additional stipend is required for that position as well.

Attached to this letter is a copy of the Board's December 2, 2025 work days resolution, a copy of NRS 178.760 regarding the state mandated stipend, and the Nevada Supreme Court's Rules of Practice for the Seventh Judicial District Court.

Also attached are copies of District Court orders for Eureka County hearings which are already set to occur on Fridays.

The Board may have concerns \$450 is too much to secure the attendance of a prosecutor for Fridays. To put that amount in perspective, a prosecutor with a salary of \$95,000 a year working 2,080 hours a year is paid an equivalent hourly wage of \$45.67. Overtime for that hourly wage is \$68.50, and 8 hours at that rate equals \$548, which is \$98 more than the \$450 requested.

In the alternative, the Board could (as it recently has done for the Undersheriff) declare the Deputy DA is an hourly and not a salaried position and allow for the Deputy DA to be eligible for overtime when work is required beyond the regular week.

The DA's Office looks forward to learning what the Board decides and will be available to answer any questions you may have.

- A.** The offices of the Eureka County Sheriff, Assessor, Clerk-Recorder, Treasurer and Comptroller (Auditor), District Attorney and Justice Court shall be open for the transaction of public business, Monday through Thursday, from 7:00 a.m. until 5:30 p.m., CLOSED for lunch between 12:30 p.m. and 1:00 p.m., and CLOSED on Friday , for a period of one year, commencing on January 4, 2026, where the schedule will be revisited during a January 2027 BOCC meeting to see if the schedule will be permanently implemented.
- B.** That the Public Works Department hours of operation for the transaction of public business will also be Monday through Thursday, from 7:00 a.m. until 5:30 p.m., OPEN for lunch between 12:30 p.m. and 1:00 p.m., and CLOSED on Friday.
- C.** The BOCC agrees that the other County Offices not mentioned in NRS 245.040 or NRS 252.050 could also adopt a 4-10 work week or flex employee hours to remain on a 5-8 work week, or do what best fits their departments and the citizens of Eureka County.

NRS 178.760 Prosecution and defense in pretrial release hearings; stipend.
Notwithstanding any other provision of law:

1. A district attorney, assistant district attorney, deputy district attorney or other attorney employed by a district attorney may:

(a) Be deputized to prosecute a person in a county other than the county by which the attorney is employed for the limited purpose of serving as the prosecuting attorney in a pretrial release hearing required by NRS 178.4849. An assistant district attorney, deputy district attorney or other attorney employed by a district attorney must receive the approval of the district attorney of the county in which the attorney is employed before serving as the prosecuting attorney in a pretrial release hearing in a county other than the county by which the attorney is employed.

(b) Receive a stipend for being available on a weekend or holiday to serve as the prosecuting attorney in a pretrial release hearing required by NRS 178.4849 or for serving as the prosecuting attorney in any such pretrial release hearing conducted on a weekend or holiday.

2. A public defender and the State Public Defender may, pursuant to an interlocal agreement, authorize the public defender, State Public Defender or any other attorney employed by the public defender or State Public Defender to provide for the representation of a defendant in a pretrial release hearing required by NRS 178.4849 in any county.

3. A public defender, the State Public Defender or any other attorney employed by the public defender or State Public Defender may receive a stipend for being available on a weekend or holiday to represent a defendant in a pretrial release hearing required by NRS 178.4849 or for representing a defendant in any such pretrial release hearing conducted on a weekend or holiday.

RULES OF PRACTICE FOR THE SEVENTH JUDICIAL DISTRICT COURT OF THE STATE OF NEVADA

ORDER

Pursuant to a petition filed August 9, 2002, by the Honorables Dan L. Papez and Steve L. Dobrescu, Judges of the Seventh Judicial District, Counties of White Pine, Eureka and Lincoln, State of Nevada, to revise the local rules governing practice in the Seventh Judicial District Court;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Rules of Practice for the Seventh Judicial District Court of the State of Nevada be, and the same hereby are, adopted. The rules shall read as set forth in Exhibit A.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Rules of Practice for the Seventh Judicial District Court of the State of Nevada shall become effective December 2, 2002. The rules shall govern all proceedings brought after that date and all further proceedings in actions pending on that date, unless in the opinion of the district court their application in a particular pending action would not be feasible or would work an injustice, in which event the former procedure applies.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Rules of Practice for the Seventh Judicial District Court of the State of Nevada approved by this Court on March 28, 1993, are hereby superseded and repealed, effective December 1, 2002; and that the clerk of this court shall cause a notice of entry of this order to be published in the official publication of the State Bar of Nevada. Publication of this order shall be accomplished by the clerk disseminating copies of this order to all subscribers of the advance sheets of the Nevada Reports and all persons and agencies listed in [NRS 2.345](#), and to the executive director of the State Bar of Nevada. The certificate of the clerk of this court as to the accomplishment of the above-described publication of notice of entry and dissemination of this order shall be conclusive evidence of the adoption and publication of the foregoing rule amendment.

RULES OF PRACTICE FOR THE SEVENTH JUDICIAL DISTRICT
COURT OF THE STATE OF NEVADA

Rule 1. Applicability and citation of rules.

1. These rules shall be known and may be cited as the Seventh Judicial District Court Rules or 7JDCR.
2. The District Court Rules promulgated by the Nevada Supreme Court shall be applied whenever not inconsistent with these local rules. To the extent these local rules are inconsistent with the District Court Rules promulgated by the Nevada Supreme Court, these local rules shall be applied instead of the District Court Rules pursuant to D.C.R. 5.
3. Whenever it appears to the Court that a particular situation does not fall within these rules, or the literal application of a rule would work hardship or injustice, the Court shall make such order as the interests of justice require.
4. These rules may be supplemented by a "Standing Order Supplementing Local Rules" signed by all District Judges in the District. The Standing Order shall be posted in the office of the Court Clerk.

Rule 2. Organization of the Court.

1. The Seventh Judicial District consists of Department One and Department Two and is comprised of White Pine, Eureka and Lincoln Counties.
2. Unless previously disqualified, in the event of the absence or inability of a Judge, or when agreed by the Judges, either Judge may temporarily act in the Department of the other without specific assignment of the actions. Cases heard by a Judge pursuant to this paragraph remain in the Department originally assigned and are not automatically transferred.
3. All actions will be assigned to a Department by the Court Clerk in alternating order.
4. Cases will not be reassigned except upon good cause and order signed by both Judges, or upon disqualification or as otherwise provided by rule or law.
5. It is the intent of the Judges, to the extent reasonably possible, to implement a "One Family/One Judge" assignment of domestic relations cases and cases involving the same

family or children. The Court Clerk and attorneys practicing within the District shall bring to the attention of the Judges, cases which might be transferred between Departments to accomplish this goal.

Rule 3. Law and motion calendar.

1. The law and motion calendar shall be called as follows:

White Pine County:	Each Monday at 9:15 a.m.
Eureka County:	The first and third Friday of each month at 10:00 a.m.
Lincoln County:	The second and fourth Friday of each month at 10:00 a.m.

2. When a legal holiday occurs on Monday, the White Pine County law and motion calendar will be called on the next succeeding day that is not a legal holiday, unless otherwise ordered by the Court. When a legal holiday occurs on Friday, the Eureka and Lincoln County law and motion calendars will be vacated, unless otherwise ordered by the Court.

3. Except as allowed by the presiding Judge, no matter will be placed on the law and motion calendar unless the Court Clerk of the appropriate county and the judicial assistant are notified by:

White Pine County:	5:00 p.m. of the preceding Thursday.
Eureka County:	5:00 p.m. of the preceding Wednesday.
Lincoln County:	5:00 p.m. of the preceding Wednesday.

[As amended; effective January 1, 2020.]

Rule 4. Setting cases for trial or hearing.

1. Criminal trials shall be set in a manner prescribed by the Judge assigned to the case.
2. To set a civil matter for trial, a party shall first attempt to reach a stipulated calendar date for trial by contacting all parties and the judicial administrator for the assigned Department. Conference calls between the parties and the judicial administrator are encouraged. If the parties and judicial administrator agree to a trial date, the judicial administrator shall prepare an order for the Judge's signature that includes the trial date, number of days set aside for trial, preference for a jury trial or bench trial, whether or not a court reporter has been requested and by whom, and a deadline for filing motions.
3. If a party is unable to obtain a stipulated calendar date for setting a civil trial, by contacting all parties and the judicial administrator, the party may file a "Motion to Set Trial" and have the matter heard on the Court's law and motion civil calendar. The party shall provide written notice to all parties at least 21 days prior to the hearing date. The motion shall contain the following paragraph:

"The undersigned has attempted to reach a stipulated trial date in this matter with the other parties and the judicial administrator and has been unable to do so. Therefore, notice is hereby given that the undersigned shall appear before this Court on the law and motion calendar at ____ p.m./a.m. on _____, the ____ day of _____, 20__, for the purpose of having this Court set this matter for trial."

At a hearing on the motion, the Court will hear arguments concerning the setting of the matter for trial, enter an appropriate order, and consider the assessment of attorney fees and costs

against any party who failed to cooperate in calendaring a matter for trial without a hearing or who unreasonably refused to set a timely date for trial.

4. If a case has been set for trial and is subsequently settled, counsel for the parties shall immediately notify the judicial administrator. A file-stamped copy of all settlement agreements in civil cases and plea agreements in criminal cases shall be delivered, immediately upon filing, to the appropriate Judge's chambers. Failure to immediately notify the Court of a settlement agreement, or misrepresenting that a settlement has been reached when one has not, is a significant violation of these rules and will subject an attorney to sanctions.

5. In civil cases, the parties shall cause to be issued an Order Setting Trial Date within 60 days following the filing of the first [N.R.C.P. 16.1](#) Conference Report. If the parties fail to comply with this requirement, unless waived by the Court, the Court may set the case for trial at its own discretion or dismiss the case without prejudice.

6. The following matters, if uncontested, may be set by the judicial administrator on any law and motion day upon request by counsel:

- (a) Default judgments.
- (b) Divorces.
- (c) Annulments.
- (d) Terminations of parental rights.
- (e) Adoptions.
- (f) Name changes.
- (g) Juvenile proceedings.
- (h) Guardianships.
- (i) Estate proceedings.
- (j) Proceedings under the Uniform Reciprocal Enforcement of Support Act.
- (k) Criminal arraignments, changes of plea, and sentencing.
- (l) Other similar matters.

7. Counsel may not remove contested matters from the calendar by calling the Court Clerk or Judge's chambers. All parties must stipulate, in writing, to vacate or continue a matter. If all parties do not stipulate in writing, a continuance may be requested by motion.

[As amended; effective January 1, 2020.]

Rule 5. Procedure in divorce cases.

1. An application or joint petition for divorce filed pursuant to [NRS 125.123](#) or [NRS 125.181](#) to [125.184](#), inclusive, shall be submitted to the court for consideration without hearing.

2. In addition to those matters described above, all contested divorces which are settled by the parties with all issues resolved, uncontested divorces and all annulments, may be submitted without hearing by agreement of the parties and with the approval of the court.

3. Affidavits in divorce cases shall comply with the requirements of [N.R.C.P. 56\(e\)](#).

4. Affidavits of residence witnesses shall state the affiant's residence address and the length of time affiant has resided in this state. The affiant shall state:

- (a) That the affiant is personally acquainted with the party to the action whose residence is being corroborated;
- (b) The party's residence address;
- (c) The date from which the affiant knows that the party has resided at that address and the total length of time affiant knows that the party has resided in the State of Nevada. If the jurisdiction of the court is based upon the minimum legal residence, the affiant shall specify the days that the party has been physically present in Nevada.

[Added; effective May 28, 2003.]

Rule 5A. Default divorce and custody cases.

1. Affidavit required in default cases involving child custody.

Where a default judgment in an action involving minor children is sought, and the proposed judgment does not include or refer to a written custody and visitation agreement, the movant shall attach an affidavit which sets forth the following:

- (a) Date the parties separated;
- (b) Person with whom the child has been living with during the past 6 months;
- (c) Extent of contact the child has had with both parents during the past 6 months;
- (d) Where a party seeks to allow visitation, the affidavit shall specify a visitation schedule for the defaulting party and child;
- (e) Where a party seeks to deny visitation between the child and defaulting party, the affidavit shall include the following:
 - (1) Specific factual reasons why visitation should be denied;
 - (2) Last time the defaulting party contacted or visited the child; and
 - (3) Last known address and whereabouts of the defaulting party.
- (f) Where a party seeks supervised visitation between the child and defaulting party, the affidavit shall specify:
 - (1) Specific factual reasons why visitation should be supervised;
 - (2) When and where supervised visitation shall take place; and
 - (3) The person or agency who shall supervise visitation.

[As amended and renumbered; effective May 28, 2003.]

Rule 6. Submission of uncontested matters. Any uncontested matter which does not require a prove up hearing may be submitted to the court in chambers. The court, in its discretion, may require a hearing on any uncontested matter.

[As amended; effective May 28, 2003.]

Rule 7. Motions.

- 1. This rule applies to all motions of a contested nature, both criminal and civil.
- 2. This rule does not apply to ex parte motions or to proposed orders stipulated to by all parties, which may be presented in chambers.
- 3. Except by leave of Court, first obtained, all motions for summary judgment must be filed at least 30 days prior to the first day of trial.
- 4. Any affidavit filed pursuant to this rule shall contain only factual, evidentiary matter, conform with the requirements of [N.R.C.P. 56](#) and avoid mere general conclusions or argument. Affidavits substantially defective in these respects may be disregarded or stricken, wholly or in part.
- 5. All motions shall contain a brief statement particularly describing the relief sought. The motion shall include, or be filed simultaneously with, the following:
 - (a) Memorandum of "Points and Authorities" in support of the motion.
 - (b) "Notice of Motion," which shall include one of the following two alternatives:
 - (1) "A hearing on this motion is not requested"; or
 - (2) "A hearing on this motion is requested and a court reporter *is/is not* requested. It is estimated that ____ hours should be set aside for the hearing on this motion." A court reporter is not provided by the Court for civil actions. The parties in civil actions must arrange for the presence and payment of a court reporter.
 - (c) Proof of service of the motion and all supporting documents.
- 6. Within 14 days after service of the motion, the opposing party shall serve and file a written opposition. Each opposition shall contain a brief statement describing the extent to

which the relief sought by the moving party is contested. Unless the entire relief sought is contested, the opposing party shall particularly delineate which portions of the relief sought in the motion are being contested. The opposition shall include, or shall be filed simultaneously with, the following:

- (a) Memorandum of “Points and Authorities in Opposition to the Motion.”
- (b) “Notice of Opposition,” which shall include one of the following two alternatives:
 - (1) “A hearing on this motion is not requested”; or
 - (2) “A hearing on this motion is requested and a court reporter *is/is not* requested. It is estimated that ____ hours should be set aside for the hearing on this motion.”
- (c) Proof of service of the opposition and all supporting documents.

7. All motions and oppositions shall be accompanied by affidavits in support of any factual contentions made in the motions or oppositions. The absence of a memorandum of Points and Authorities in support of the motion or in opposition may be construed by the Court as an admission that the motion or opposition is not meritorious and is cause for granting or denying the motion.

8. Counsel may extend the time for filing an opposition, without an order from the Court, by filing a written stipulation.

9. The moving party may serve and file a reply Points and Authorities within 5 days after service of the answering Points and Authorities.

10. The Judge may be unaware of the existence of a motion until the filing of a “Request for Review.” Any party may file a “Request for Review” whenever a motion is at issue. When a party files a “Request for Review,” the Court Clerk shall deliver that file to the Judge’s chambers for consideration of the motion.

11. A decision shall be rendered without hearing unless oral argument or an evidentiary hearing is ordered by the Court, in which event the Court will issue an order setting a date and time for a hearing.

12. Proposed orders shall accompany the motion and opposition.

13. A courtesy copy of all motions and oppositions shall be provided to the Judge’s chambers by counsel when the original is filed.

14. Except in extraordinary circumstances, all motions in limine or other motions seeking a ruling on the admissibility of evidence shall be filed and served at least 15 days prior to the first day of trial.

[As amended; effective January 1, 2020.]

Rule 8. Motions for temporary fees and allowances.

1. A motion for temporary fees and allowances shall be accompanied by an affidavit describing the financial condition and needs of the movant. The affidavit may be prepared on a form approved by the Court or the movant may file a separately prepared affidavit containing substantially similar information. Absence of an affidavit of financial condition may be construed as an admission that the motion is not meritorious and may be cause for denial.

2. Each response to a motion for temporary fees and allowances shall include an affidavit of financial condition. Failure to serve and file a written declaration of financial condition may be construed by the Court as an admission that the motion is meritorious and consent to grant such relief as may be just.

3. An affidavit of financial condition may not be filed in open court.

Rule 9. Trial statements; settlement conference.

1. At least 10 days prior to a civil trial, counsel for all parties shall meet or discuss by telephone, and stipulate to as many facts and issues as possible, or state why they cannot do

so. A certification that this rule has been complied with shall be annexed to the trial statement and made a part thereof.

2. At least 7 days prior to a civil trial, each party shall file and serve on all other parties a trial statement that sets forth the following matters in the following order:

- (a) Concise statement of the claimed facts that supports the party's claims or defenses.
- (b) Statement of admitted or undisputed facts.
- (c) Statement of issues of law supported by a memorandum of Points and Authorities.
- (d) In nonjury cases, a list of summaries or schedules referring to:

(1) Attached itemized exhibits concerning any subject matter that involves accounting, computation, chronology, or similar detailed data reasonably called for orderly itemization (e.g., wages, income, expenses, inventories, business operations, tax computations, disability periods, property losses, and itemizations of claimed losses or injuries);

(2) Data and reasons upon which an expert bases his or her opinion (not the opinion itself) that clearly reflect the claims, defenses, or offers of proof of the party in such respects; and

(3) Reference to records or other sources upon which summaries or schedules are based.

(e) Names and addresses of all witnesses, except impeaching witnesses.

(f) List of special questions requested to be propounded to prospective jurors.

(g) Any other appropriate comment, suggestion, or information that may assist the Court in the trial or disposition of the case.

(h) Any other information required by the Court.

(i) List of exhibits that the parties have stipulated to be admitted.

(j) List of exhibits offered by the opposing party that are objected to and the reasons for the objections.

(k) List of any pending motions that have not been resolved.

3. In a contested domestic relations case, the parties shall complete, file with the Court, and serve on the opposing party a current financial declaration no later than 5 days prior to the date set for a trial or hearing.

4. At the request of Court or counsel, the Court may order a settlement conference.

[As amended; effective January 1, 2020.]

Rule 10. Jury instructions.

1. Unless otherwise ordered by the Court, standard jury instructions in criminal cases will be provided by the Court.

2. In civil cases, counsel for the parties shall meet and stipulate to a set of standard instructions which the Plaintiff will then submit to the Court no later than 5 judicial days prior to trial.

3. Proposed special instructions shall be delivered to the Judge and opposing counsel at least 2 judicial days prior to trial.

4. All proposed special instructions shall be in legible type on 8 1/2 by 11 inch heavy white paper, not lighter than 16 pound weight, with a black border and no less than 24 numbered lines.

5. The designation "Instruction No. ____" shall be located at the top center of each page.

6. All special instructions shall be accompanied by a duplicate instruction which cites to authority. The citation shall be located in the lower left corner of each page.

7. Counsel should be prepared to settle jury instructions immediately following the completion of the taking of evidence.

Rule 11. Voir dire examination.

1. The Judge shall conduct the voir dire examination of potential jurors. Proposed voir dire questions requested by the parties or their attorneys must be submitted to the Judge's chambers not less than 5 days prior to trial. Upon request, the Judge may permit counsel to supplement the judge's examination with oral and direct questioning of prospective jurors. The scope of additional questions or supplemental examination must remain within reasonable limits prescribed by the Judge.

2. The following areas of inquiry are not properly within the scope of voir dire examination by counsel:

- (a) Questions already asked and answered.
- (b) Questions relating to anticipated instructions on the law.
- (c) Questions relating to the verdict a juror would return based upon hypothetical facts.
- (d) Questions which are in substance arguments of the case.
- (e) Questions which are not directly related to the qualifications of a juror.

Rule 12. Exhibits and contested evidence.

1. Prior to a trial or hearing, counsel for the parties shall meet or discuss by telephone, and stipulate to the admission of as many exhibits as possible. Such stipulation will avoid the need for foundational witnesses.

2. All proposed exhibits shall be presented to the Court Clerk to be marked at least 1 judicial day prior to a trial or hearing.

3. Copies of proposed exhibits shall be furnished to the opposing party before a trial or hearing commences. This rule does not relieve a party of the duty to provide discovery under any other rule or statute.

4. Counsel are encouraged to raise contested issues by motions in limine prior to trial. All issues regarding the admissibility of statements by a defendant in a criminal case, or prior bad acts of a party or witness shall be raised by motion prior to trial.

[As amended; effective May 28, 2003.]

Rule 13. Ex parte orders. Ex parte orders are disfavored and counsel are encouraged to move with notice whenever possible.

Rule 14. Documents of the court; pleading requirements. All proposed findings, conclusions of law, judgments and decrees, orders affecting the title to or creating or affecting a lien upon real or personal property, appealable orders, and such other orders as the Court may direct shall be prepared in writing by the attorney for the prevailing party, embody the Court's decision, where applicable, and incorporate the decision by reference, unless the Court otherwise orders. Counsel for the prevailing party shall, within 10 days of the Court's order, serve a copy of the proposed document upon counsel for all parties who have appeared and are affected by the order. Any objection to the form or substance of any document, or a motion to amend it, shall be filed within 5 days after service on opposing counsel of the proposed findings and judgments. If no objection or motion to amend is filed with the Court, counsel shall then submit the proposed document to the Court.

Rule 15. Settlements in jury trials. A civil case in which a jury has been summoned may only be settled if one or more of the parties involved reimburse the county for all expenses incurred in summoning and securing the attendance of prospective jurors up to the date of settlement.

Rule 16. Filing of faxed documents.

1. No document may be filed by direct faxing to the Court Clerk.
2. A faxed document, including any signature page, may be presented to the Court Clerk for filing, in lieu of the original, if the document:
 - (a) Is submitted to the Clerk either in person or by mail;
 - (b) Is presented on plain paper;
 - (c) Is clearly legible in its entirety; and
 - (d) Otherwise complies with all applicable requirements, including payment of any filing fees.
3. The party filing a faxed document shall preserve the original until the completion of the case.

Rule 17. Sanctions for noncompliance. If a party or an attorney fails and/or refuses to comply with these rules, the Nevada Rules of Civil Procedure, the District Court Rules, the Supreme Court Rules, or any other requirement of Nevada law, the Court may, after notice and an opportunity to be heard, make such orders and impose such sanctions as are just, including, but without limitation, the following:

1. Hold the disobedient party or attorney in contempt of court.
2. Continue a hearing or trial until the disobedient party or attorney has complied with the requirements imposed and require the disobedient party to pay the opposing party's expenses incurred to prepare for and attend the hearing or trial, including, but not limited to, reasonable attorneys' fees and witness fees.
3. Refuse to allow the disobedient party or attorney to support or oppose designated claims or defenses, or prohibit the introduction into evidence of designated documents or things or items of testimony.
4. Set the case for immediate trial.

Rule 18. Notice of diversion program. In any criminal case in which a defendant intends to enroll in a diversion program and to request that the proceedings be suspended and/or no formal judgment be entered, counsel for defendant shall, as soon as practicable, file and serve notice on the prosecutor's office. If a diversion program is sought, said notice shall provide specific information regarding the program. Copies of supporting documents or other relevant information shall be attached to said notice.

Rule 19. Application for Special Court. In any criminal case in which a defendant seeks admission to a specialty court, counsel for the defendant shall, as soon as practicable, confer with the prosecutor's office regarding the matter. Counsel for the defendant shall then file a petition seeking admission to the specialty court and serve a copy of the petition on the prosecutor's office. Said petition shall indicate whether the prosecutor's office agrees to or opposes the application.

[Added; effective June 4, 2010.]

Rule 20. Business matters. "Business matters" shall be matters in which the primary claims or issues are based on, or will require decision under [NRS Chapters 78-92A](#) or other similar statutes from other jurisdictions, without regard to the amount in controversy.

Any of the following where the amount in controversy is \$10,000 or more, excluding costs, fees, interest, and/or punitive damages:

- (i) Claims or cases arising under the Uniform Commercial Code, or in which the Code will apply;
- (ii) Claims arising from business torts;

- (iii) Claims arising from the purchase or sale of (A) the stock of a business; (B) all or substantially all of the assets of a business; or (C) commercial real estate;
- (iv) Business franchise transactions and relationships; or
- (v) All other business-related transactions and/or relationships.

Examples of cases that are not business matters. Examples of cases which are not business matters include, but are not limited to, those for which the predominant legal issues are centered on:

- (1) Personal injury;
- (2) Products liability;
- (3) Claims brought by a consumer individually or as a representative of a class against a business;
- (4) Landlord-tenant disputes involving residential property;
- (5) Occupational health or safety;
- (6) Environmental claims which do not arise as a result of the sale or disposition of a business subject to subsection (iii) above;
- (7) Eminent domain;
- (8) Malpractice;
- (9) Employment law, including but not limited to wrongful termination of employment;
- (10) Administrative agency, tax, zoning, and other appeals;
- (11) Petition actions involving public elections;
- (12) Residential real estate disputes between individuals or between an individual and an association of homeowners;
- (13) Claims to collect professional fees;
- (14) Declaratory judgment as to insurance coverage for a personal injury or property damage action;
- (15) Proceedings to register or enforce a judgment regardless of the nature of the underlying case;
- (16) Actions by insurers to collect premiums or rescind policies;
- (17) Construction defect claims involving primarily residential units;
- (18) The granting, denying, or withholding of governmental approvals, permits, licenses, variances, registrations, or findings of suitability; and
- (19) Cases filed under [NRS 3.223](#) in the family division.

In the event an action is not filed as a business matter, the court may, after giving notice to all parties, designate the action as a business matter and order that the filing fee/answer/appearance/fee for a business matter be tendered to the Clerk of the Court within thirty (30) days.

Rule 21. Complex Litigation. Complex litigation means:

Potentially difficult or protracted action that may involve complex issues, multiple parties, difficult legal issues or unusual proof problems. In the event an action is not filed as a complex litigation, the court may, after giving notice to all parties, designate the action as a complex litigation and order that the filing fee/answer/appearance/fee for complex litigation be tendered to the Clerk of the Court within thirty (30) days.

[Added; effective June 4, 2010.]

Rule 22. Review of Recommendations by Juvenile Court Masters. In the event a person entitled to notice pursuant to [NRS 62B.030](#) objects to recommendations or findings of fact by the juvenile master, or requests a hearing de novo, he/she shall file, not later than five

(5) days after the master provides written notice of his recommendations, an objection and/or request which specifically and concisely details his/her objection, and specifies the part of the recommendations he/she finds erroneous, and the ultimate relief requested. The judge shall, after reviewing a transcript or audio recording of the proceeding:

(a) Approve the master's recommendations, in whole or in part, and order the recommended disposition;

(b) Reject the master's recommendations, in whole or in part, and order such relief as may be appropriate; or

(c) Set the matter for a hearing de novo.

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



Equity Findings:

- A. The proposed Step 6 (\$29.07) is one step above the only current Deputy Clerk Recorder II incumbent but is justified by the candidate's prior direct experience in the same position, which the incumbent did not possess at hire.
- B. The proposed rate remains below another EO9 employee at Step 7 and well below EO9 position with enhanced or elected duties, preventing compression.
- C. Placement aligns with the policy requirement that advanced hires do not exceed compensation levels of employees with comparable experience and skills.

6. ADVANCED STEP HIRE JUSTIFICATION (POLICY 5.7.3)

The request meets all conditions outlined in Eureka County Personnel Policy 5.7.3:

1. Qualifications Commensurate with Requested Step

The Candidate previously performed the same role for Eureka County, requiring minimal training and allowing for immediate productivity at a higher-than entry level.

**Minimum Information Required for an
Operation and Maintenance Manual**

The minimum information required for all operation and maintenance (O&M) manuals is listed below. NDEP's Bureau of Water Pollution Control (BWPC) requires O&M manuals as a compliance item in most of its Discharge Permits. The extent of the information will vary for different O&M manuals depending upon the complexity of the Discharge Permit. Larger projects may have separate documents for some of the requirements herein. For those projects it is acceptable to refer to the separate document and indicate in which binder it is located. The O&M manual must be bound in a three ring binder and must include at least:

- 1) Table of Contents - A table of contents with page numbers for the different chapters and lists of all graphs and figures.
- 2) Introduction - Describe the purpose of the O&M manual and how to use it. Provide a brief description of the operation of the facility, summarize emergency procedures and provide a summary of each chapter. Establish the operator's responsibilities.
- 3) Description of the Operation of the Facility - Describe the operation of the facility. Some facilities obviously will have more complex operations than others. Describe the operations of the facility in sufficient detail that another operator, technician or engineer could understand the operation of the facility. Describe the functions of the individual plant units, if applicable, and the operational procedures for each unit. Include a flow diagram with all critical valves and provide a list of the principal design criteria. Include a discussion of all the Discharge Permit requirements which must be satisfied along with a program to satisfy all the requirements. A copy of the Discharge Permit should also be included in the appendix. If applicable, describe the treated effluent sludge disposal and all critical elements of the disposal system.
- 4) Collection System Description, Operation and Maintenance (For wastewater treatment facilities only) - Describe the sewage collection system including pipe size, material and lengths of various pipe sizes. Discuss the infiltration/inflow in the collection system. Provide a location for all lift stations. Include an O&M discussion for each lift station with procedures for establishing wet well levels. Provide an inspection schedule and a sample of the record keeping log sheet with a description of how to complete the record. List the equipment and personnel available to maintain the collection system along with a maintenance schedule.

Provide a description for the O&M of the sanitary sewers including a discussion of

methods to clean sewers and a schedule for periodic maintenance. Also, describe the procedure to clear a blocked sewer line.

Provide a discussion of the type of industry and commerce which discharge to the sewers and provide a characterization of the wastewater. Provide a discussion of all existing controls for industrial/commercial discharge such as grease interceptors, industrial waste control programs, pretreatment requirements etc.

- 5) Treatment Operations - Provide a detailed discussion of the operation and control of each unit of treatment including sludge processing. The parameters for operation must be included. Include a schematic of major units with valves. Discuss all automatic controls and the procedures used to set those controls. Discuss any special features of each unit and the relationship between the units. Discuss common operating problems, how to recognize them, how to avoid them and what to do when they occur. Provide an inspection schedule, sampling schedule and a sample of the record keeping log sheet with a description of how to complete the record.

Provide a discussion of the electrical power source and alternative energy. Include a schematic of the power distribution system and the control system. Describe the preventive maintenance for the electrical system.

- 6) Maintenance - Provide a schedule for maintenance of all equipment, including mobile equipment, all buildings and all ancillary equipment. Include a sample maintenance report and control system with a description of how to use the system. Provide a list of appropriate spare parts to have available on site. List all equipment with appropriate data along with the name, address and telephone number for parts, replacement and repair. Indicate where all shop drawings, manufacturer's manuals, test data and "as-built" construction drawings are stored.

Describe the flow measuring system. Provide a detailed discussion of the procedure to calibrate the flow measuring devices.

- 7) Liner Maintenance – Provide a liner inspection process (if applicable) in the manual. Items such as visual inspection of clay-lined ponds for cracking, burrowing animal issues, and vegetation needs to be provided. For membrane liners, an examination schedule to verify secure anchor fastening, liner conditions, seepage, and other concerns. Since the liner surface can be slick when wet, the operator needs to take care when working around or on top of the liner surface. An emergency egress system should be incorporated (e.g., knotted ropes, corner escape steps/ladders and life buoys).
- 8) Monitoring - Discuss all monitoring that is necessary for process control a schedule for that monitoring and describe the reasons for it. Discuss all monitoring required for the discharge permit, the schedule and where to file the report. Also explain in detail the procedure to accurately complete the discharge monitoring report. Explain how to collect samples and to preserve them if necessary. Provide the procedures for laboratory analysis or make reference to a proper methods manual and where the manual is located. Provide a list of equipment, supplies and chemicals required for the laboratory. Provide a sample of a record keeping log sheet with a description of how to complete the record. Discuss the significance of various parameters that are monitored. In addition, a liner inspection checklist is to be added for any relevant components that use a liner system.

- 9) Budget - Establish the manpower requirements, qualifications, level of certification and salary costs. List all required utilities with estimate of the annual costs. List all required chemicals, amount, grade of chemicals, suppliers with telephone numbers/addresses and annual cost. Include with the list of chemicals the proper handling procedures, description of use, hazards and how to provide proper controls. Provide a list of maintenance materials such as spare parts, paint, grease and oil with proper grade, annual amount, suppliers and annual cost. Include all additional annual expenses and provide a total estimated annual cost. Provide a sample form for preparation of an annual budget for operation and maintenance.

- 10) Emergency - Develop an analysis of the vulnerability of the plant to emergencies. List all alarms at the plant, describe their function and where the alarm will be displayed. List the emergencies and develop procedures to be followed. Provide 24 hour telephone numbers for the notification of all appropriate health, safety and/or regulatory agencies. Also list with telephone numbers emergency sources of assistance.
- 11) Safety - Develop a plan for continuing safe operation and maintenance. Highlight areas of potential hazards and methods to avoid danger. Discuss personnel hygiene and inoculations for wastewater plant workers. Discuss proper housekeeping necessary for a safe working environment.
- 12) Appendix - Include all appropriate items that have not been included elsewhere. This would be items like:

- Major engineering design parameters
- Discharge Permit
- Sample Discharge Monitoring Report
- Sample operation and maintenance reports
- List of References
- Sewer Ordinance
- Piping color code
- Suppliers
- Effluent Management Plan (if appropriate)
- Superintendents letter of approval of the manual

As a general comment the manual must be written in easily understandable English. It should be written in a positive manner and emphasis the benefit to the community from well operated and maintained facilities. The manual should make a strong effort to instill pride in the plant workers for their work.

For new and expanded wastewater treatment facilities a draft manual must be available prior to start up. The final manual must be available within six months of startup.

Dear Jon,

In accordance with the Eureka County Code, Title 9, Chapter 40, Section 030 and the Eureka County Master Plan Natural Resources and Federal or State Land-Use Element, the Eureka County Board of Commissioners offer formal, yearly written notice as follows:

- A. That the County government of Eureka County demands, pursuant to adopted federal statutes and regulations, full and complete notice and opportunity for involvement in the decision making processes of the federal entity that:
 1. Are being taken or are being proposed to be taken regarding federal lands located within the State of Nevada;
 2. Involve listing, de-listing, classification or reclassification of a threatened or endangered species or any designated habitat within the County; or
 3. Involve any major federal action significantly affecting the quality of the human and natural environment within the County;
- B. That failure of federal entities to afford Eureka County complete notice and opportunity for involvement beyond that afforded individuals, or to limit State and County government involvement, input to or comment at public hearings, is presumed to be prejudicial to the government of Eureka County and its residents, and that the Board of Eureka County Commissioners is authorized and empowered by this chapter to authorize and instruct the Eureka County District Attorney to seek redress for such prejudice in the federal courts and through administrative hearings;
- C. That, within the County's budgetary constraints, the County will notify federal entities of any other evidence of our interrelated historic, cultural and environmental heritage, as well as the anticipated impact on the same of any use of federal or private lands situated within the County.

Our intentions have not changed; we believe the people and land we serve have much to gain from our efforts to work together, and much to lose otherwise. We value a strong and respectful working relationship with BLM and wish to openly and actively coordinate in ***all*** BLM actions affecting Eureka County. Our goal is to help BLM achieve consistency with the plans, policies, proposals and controls of the County to the maximum extent possible and to openly communicate and strive towards consistency when it is not met. Principled coordination helps to put to rest past conflicts and facilitate an effective working relationship into the future.

Please share this letter with your staff to ensure they are aware of this desire for enhanced and principled coordination.

We look forward to working with you in an effective, coordinated, working relationship throughout 2026 and beyond.

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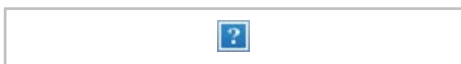

Re: District Attorney Request for Friday Stipend Related to 4/10 Schedule

Communication Purpose

This communication addresses the District Attorney's request that the Board approve an additional \$450 stipend for Fridays if the District Attorney's Office were to move to a 4/10 work schedule and clarifies whether such compensation is required under Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS), the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) or the Department of Indigent Defense Services (DIDS).

I. Applicability of 4/10 Schedule

Eureka County's 4/10 work schedule is an employee scheduling framework implemented pursuant to wage and hour authority under NRS Chapter 608 and FLSA 29 U.S.C.

- The 4/10 schedule is designed for county employees, not elected officials.
- Elected officials, including the District Attorney, are not governed by employee work schedules and are not required to participate in a 4/10 or any alternative work schedule.
- Elected official duties and work hours are dictated by the office and statutory responsibilities, not by internal employee scheduling structures.
- The District Attorney may independently determine workdays necessary to fulfill statutory duties.
- The District Attorney is neither required to adopt nor restricted by the County's 4/10 employee schedule.

The District Attorney's Office is not required to adopt the 4/10 schedule, and the County is not obligated to restructure compensation for an elected official based on an employee scheduling model.

II. Elected Officials Are Not Entitled to Overtime or Schedule-Based Premium Pay

Under federal and state law:

- Elected officials are excluded from FLSA overtime requirements.
- They are not classified as hourly or overtime-eligible employees.

- Compensation for elected officials is set by statute and Board action, not by hours worked or schedule configuration.

There is no statutory basis to treat a Friday workday for an elected District Attorney as triggering overtime, premium pay or a stipend simply because other employees may be on a 4/10 schedule.

III. Statutory Weekend Stipends Under Nevada Law

NRS 178.760 – Pretrial Release Hearings

Nevada law requires that individuals arrested be brought before a magistrate within 48 hours. NRS 178.760 authorizes compensation for judicial and prosecutorial availability when such hearings occur on weekends or holidays.

Key statutory limitations:

- The statute authorizes stipends only for weekend or holiday availability or service.
- It does not authorize weekday stipends.
- It does not expand compensation based on schedule restructuring.

IV. Weekend Stipends Paid Through DIDS Are Statutorily Limited

Nevada law authorizes stipends related to weekend or holiday pretrial release (arraignment) hearings required to occur within 48 hours of arrest.

The Department of Indigent Defense Services (DIDS) administers funding approved by the Legislature to support compliance with weekend and holiday arraignment requirements.

Key clarifications:

- The funding is case-driven and duty-specific and does not create ongoing salary entitlements.
- The stipend is specifically tied to weekend or holiday availability or service.
- Funding administered through DIDS is intended to support Saturday/Sunday or holiday coverage, not weekday court appearances.
- The statute does not extend stipend eligibility for Fridays or other regular business days.
- The stipend exists to address a statutory mandate, not to supplement salary due to schedule changes.

The fact that a stipend is paid for weekend or holiday arraignment duties does not create a legal obligation for the County to pay a similar stipend for Fridays or any weekday work.

V. No Statutory Requirements for a Friday Stipend

There is:

- No NRS provision requiring counties to pay a stipend to a District Attorney for Friday work.
- No linkage in statute between adopting a 4/10 schedule and triggering additional compensation for elected officials.
- No specific statutory mandate or Board-approved compensation policy that requires the Board to approve additional pay,

The Board retains full discretion and is not legally required to approve a \$450 Friday stipend for the District Attorney or the District Attorney's Office.

VI. Summary and Recommendation

There are no legal requirements under the Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS), the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA), or Department of Indigent Defense Services (DIDS) funding provisions that obligates Eureka County to pay a Friday stipend to the District Attorney.

The Board may deny the request for a Friday stipend and formally clarify that:

- Participation in the 4/10 schedule is optional and unnecessary for elected officials as they are excluded from employee scheduling requirements.
- Weekend/holiday stipends authorized by statute do not apply to Fridays.
- The County is not obligated under NRS or FLSA to provide any additional stipend to the District Attorney related to a 4/10 schedule.

VII. Additional Information Regarding District Attorney's Office Employees Participation on 4/10 schedule

Employees may participate in a 4/10 schedule only if:

- The Board has approved 4/10 schedules countywide or for specific departments, and
- The schedule does not interfere with statutory duties or services coverage.

The elected official retains operational authority to determine:

- Which employees can reasonably work a 4/10 schedule
- How coverage is maintained on Fridays
- Whether certain positions require a traditional 5/8 schedule

Employees do not receive stipends or premium pay simply because:

- Their department operates under an elected official
- They work on Fridays
- The elected official receives a statutory weekend stipend

If an employee works on Friday, it is treated as:

- A regular scheduled workday (for 5/8 employees or 4/10 employees with flex schedule), or
- A scheduled day off (for 4/10 employees), unless operational needs require otherwise

No employee's pay changes solely because the DA is an elected official or receives weekend stipends.

Human Resource Summary

Human Resources has carefully reviewed the District Attorney's request. Based on this review HR has determined that the County is not legally required to provide an additional stipend as requested. Even though the Eureka County BOCC has discretion to approve this request, discretion does not equal obligation.

The role of Human Resources is to assess risk and ensure consistent application of state law and Board policy across all departments, including those led by elected officials. From an HR risk standpoint, approving this would create precedent across all elected offices and triggering similar requests from other elected officials. This could also undermine the distinction between employee schedules and elected compensation and may create audit and equity issues later. Denying it is consistent with law, policy and fiscal responsibility.

My recommendation is to keep the decision grounded strictly in statute and policy, not workload comparison or fairness arguments.

Human Resources appreciate the work of the District Attorney's Office and believe these clarifications provide consistency and transparency for the County as a whole.
